## Wedding ring history

The beginning of the tradition of wedding rings is <u>not</u> clear, but some experts <u>think</u> that it started in ancient Egypt.

For people in Egypt, a ring showed **eternity** because it had no <u>beginning</u> and no end. <u>They</u> also believed in the **vein** of love, which connects to the heart. <u>It</u> is in the fourth finger on the left hand, and it explains why <u>people</u> wear a wedding ring on this <u>finger</u>.

Later, this tradition came to Greece and then Rome, where they believed that the ring showed that a man owned his wife. During World War II, men gave rings to <u>women</u> as a promise to marry <u>them</u> when they returned home.

Diamond rings became popular in the 1950s; company De Beers said in its slogan that diamonds last forever. Today, 86% of engagement rings in the US are diamond rings.
